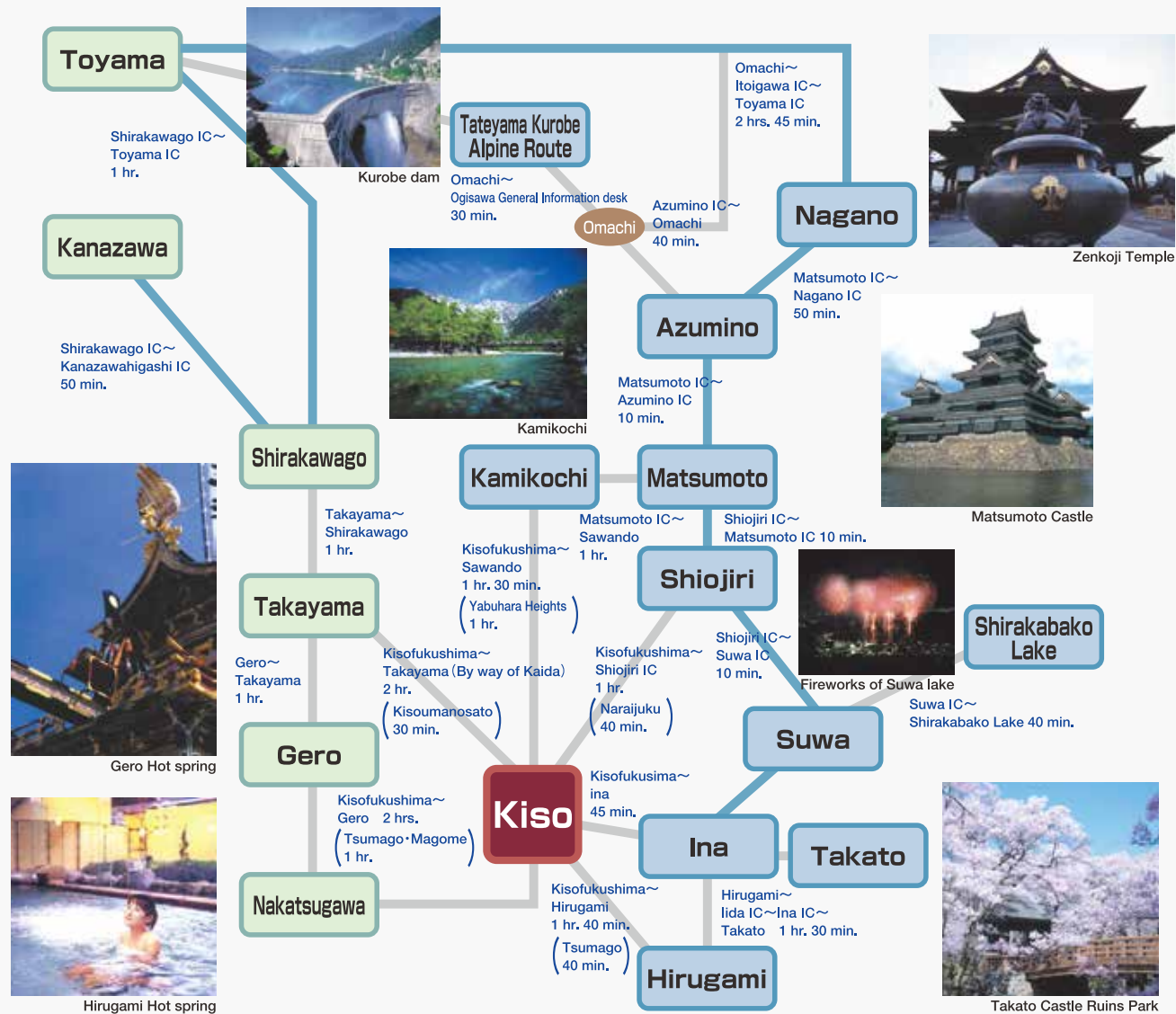
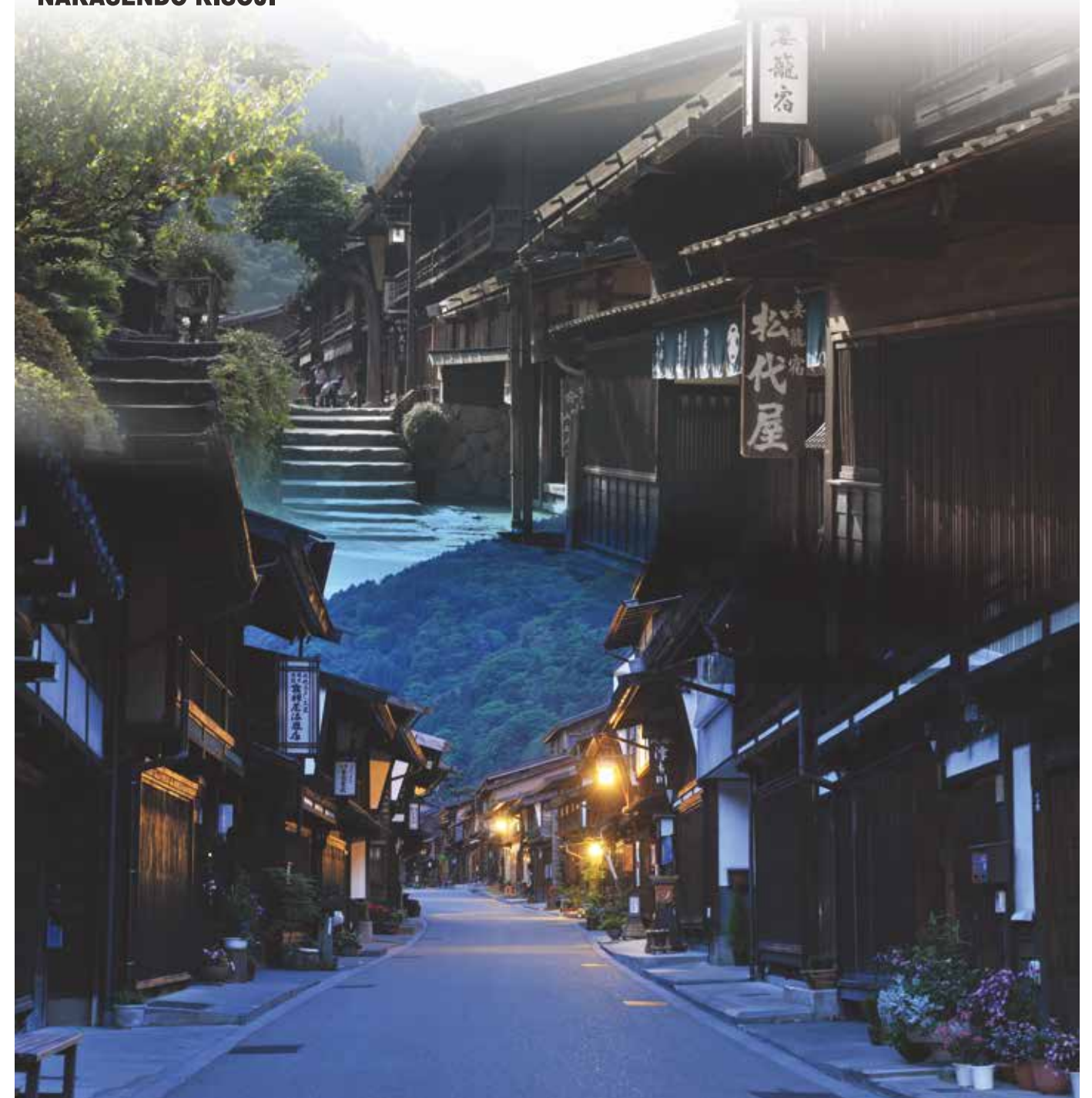

### ■ NARAIJUKU

Naraijuku is located at the foot of the Torii Mountain Pass. It once flourished as a post town, and was referred to as "Narai of a Thousand buildings". They are designated as a Protected Area for the Preservation of Traditional Buildings by the government.

#### [Attractions]

Kamidonya Museum of History (The Tezuka Family House), The Nakamura Family House, Christian statue of the Virgin Mary in Daihoji Temple, etc.



### ■ YABUHARAJUKU

Yabuharajuku was a bustling town at the Oiwake Junction on the Hida Kaido (Road) in the vicinity of the rugged Torii Mountain Pass. This place is especially famous for its Orokugushi comb, and they have been manufactured from the town's foundation and still even today.

#### [Attractions]

Gokurakuji Temple, Yabuhara Shrine, etc.



### ■ MIYANOKOSHIJUKU

Miyanakoshijuku will give you the impression of the home of the Kiso carpenter works throughout the region. Those old and beautifully preserved houses with elaborate carvings and superior workmanship remind one of the old days. This post town is also closely connected to Kiso Yoshinaka feudal warlord, and well known as a historical place.

### ■ NIEKAWAJUKU

Niekawajuku creates a tranquil feeling with its old post town stretched out along the center of the Kiso Valley. Niekawa Sekisho (checkpoint) was once the base of defense in the Kiso region, and is now restored to the way it used to be. It welcomes you at the entrance of the town.

#### [Attractions]

Fukasawake-jutaku (The Fukusawa Family House), Kannonji Temple, etc.

### ■ FUKUSHIMAJUKU

Fukushimajuku is now a cultural and political center of the district. There was one of the Four Greatest Checkpoints called Fukushima Sekisho.

#### [Attractions]

Fukushima Sekisho Shiryokan (museum), Yamamura-daikan-yashiki (House of Yamamura Local Governor), Kare-sansui Garden in Kozenji Temple, etc.

### ■ MIDONOJUKU

Midonojuku was one of the more profitable towns, along with Tsumagojuku. Most structures were burnt down by massive fires in 1881. However, the few remaining houses, characterized by the upper floors protruding forward over the lower floor and the guard walls (to protect against the neighbors if on fire) brings back some of that olden time.



### ■ TSUMAGOJUKU

Tsumagojuku was the first post town in Japan that preserved its historic streets, now selected as a Protected Area for the Preservation of Traditional Buildings by the government.

[Attractions] Wakihonjin-okuya, Kamisagaya, Kotokuji Temple, etc.

### ■ MAGOMEJUKU

Magomejuku is built along a hillside with its beautifully arranged stone paved street. The restored old style houses remind you of the way it used to be. This town is also known as the birthplace of the famous Japanese author Shimazaki Toson.

#### [Attractions]

Magome Wakihonjin Shiryokan (museum), Toson Memorial Museum, etc.

# NAKASENDO KISOJI

National Highway 19 (Route 19), or Kisoji, goes through Shiojiri City, the Kiso Valley in Nagano Prefecture and Nakatsugawa City in Gifu Prefecture. This road used to be a part of the Nakasendo. The Nakasendo was one of the old roads made in Japan's Edo Period (1603~1867). It started from Edo (present-day Tokyo), reaching Kyoto via the Kiso Valley. Many people have traveled on Kisoji since then, and still the old Japanese scenery lives on.

Travel on Kisoji and feel the history and culture of Kiso and enjoy its numerous and beautiful sights.



### ■ AGEMATSUJUKU

Agematsujuku made great business as a trading center of Kiso Hinoki (cypress) at one time.

#### [Attractions]

Nezame-no-toko (natural beauty site), Kiso-no-kakehashi (Bridge), etc.



### ■ NOJIRIJUKU

Nojirijuku is characterized by its winding street called "Nanamagari", which was constructed to protect the town from enemy invasions in old times. There is a stone statue called "the Virgin Mary Kannon" holding a cross in its left hand at the Myokakuji Temple, a Buddhist temple near the town.



### ■ SUHARAJUKU

Suharajuku is well known for pickled cherry blossoms, a traditional specialty from the Edo Era (17C to mid-19C). You will see vegetables and fruits floating in spring water in "Mizubune" (hollowed out log tubs) along the street which create an old town atmosphere.

#### [Attractions]

Joshoji Temple (National Important Cultural Property): the main hall, the gate, a cypress statue of Bodhidharma, etc.

# Cultural Properties in Kisoji



**Tsumagojuku**  
(Protected Area for the Preservation of Traditional Buildings by the government / Nagiso Town)  
It is the 42nd post town from Nihonbashi Bridge on the Nakasendo. This town was developed as a transportation hub. Its old-established townscape and vibrant atmosphere are perfectly harmonious.



**Naraijuku**  
(Protected Area for the Preservation of Traditional Buildings by the government / Narai, Shiojiri City)  
It was once flourishing as a post town, and referred to as "Narai of a Thousand Buildings". Those preserved inns and houses preserve the atmosphere of an old post town of the Edo Era.



**Kiso Hirasawa, a town of lacquerware**  
(Protected Area for the Preservation of Traditional Buildings by the government / Hirasawa, Shiojiri City)  
With its plentiful supply of good wood, it gradually developed a certain prestige for its lacquerware. This highly-sophisticated technique is designated as a National Traditional Manufactured Article.



**The Fukasawa Family House**  
(National Important Cultural Property / Niekawa, Shiojiri City)  
Also known as Kano-ya and located in Niekawajuku, this house preserves the style of the traditional town house in its beautiful architecture. It was built in the 7th year of the Kaei Era (1848-1854).



**The Tezuka Family House**  
(National Important Cultural Property / Narai, Shiojiri City)  
The main house is a traditional wooden townhouse with beautifully designed lattice windows. The back parlor and Dozo (storehouse) are separate from the main building. The Tezuka family flourished as a wholesale dealer during the Tenpo Era (1830-1844).



**Joshoji Temple**  
(National Important Cultural Property / Okuwa Village)  
Joshoji Temple is the oldest among the three important temples in Kiso. It is located at the southern end of Suharajuku. Enjoy the magnificent architectural style from the Momoyama Era (late 16C) used in the main hall (Hondo), the priests living quarters (Kuri) and the gate (Sanmon).



**Hakusan Shrine**  
(National Important Cultural Property / Okuwa Village)  
The sanctuaries are the oldest buildings from the Kamakura Era (14C) in Nagano Prefecture. This shrine enshrines four deities: Hakusan (the goddess of marriage), Izu (the god of mountains), Zao and Kumano (the gods of nation-building). The long stone steps and a pair of stone guardian dogs welcome visitors.



**Kakizore Water Route**  
(National Important Cultural Property / Nagiso Town)  
It is the gateway to the Kakizore-keikoku (gorge). The admirable two-story water route supplies water to the Yomikaki Hydroelectric Power Station. It was constructed in the 12th year of the Taisho Era (1923).



**Yomikaki Hydroelectric Power Station**  
(National Important Cultural Property / Nagiso Town)  
This water power electricity generating plant was constructed in the 12th year of the Taisho Era (1923) with the maximum output power of 40700kW. The brick wall and semicircle windows feature the modern western style of that time.



**Momosuke bashi Bridge**  
(National Important Cultural Property / Nagiso Town)  
This bridge was built by Fukuzawa Momosuke who was revered and acclaimed as the king of developing hydroelectric power stations in Japan. The total length of this bridge is 247 meters, and is one of the largest wooden suspension bridges in Japan.



**Wakihonjin Okuya**  
(National Important Cultural Property / Nagiso Town)  
Wakihonjin Okuya served as a wholesale dealer in Tsumago. When more lodging was required by official travelers, the structure also served as an inn for them. Japanese cypress have surrounded the existing building since in the 10th year of the Meiji Era (1877).



**The Yamashita Family House**  
(Prefectural Treasure / Kaida Heights, Kiso Town)  
The Yamashita Family is ancestor to a horse doctor, called Hakuraku. It is also known that they come of an ancient homestead as the major landowner. The original form of the house in the late Edo Era is well preserved and gives visitors its overall Edo appearance today.



**Chikoji Temple Yakushido**  
(Prefectural Treasure / Okuwa Village)  
The one-story wooden building was built in the Kamakura architectural style in the early 14th century. A sedentary statue of Yakushi Nyorai (the Healing Buddha) is enshrined there.



**Kiso Lacquerware**  
(National Traditional Manufactured Article)  
This is the National Traditional Manufactured Article with a history of roughly 400 years. Kiso lacquerwares are made from the good wood and natural lacquer in Kiso. You can feel the soul of the experienced craftsman in this traditional technique.



**Rokuro Woodturning Craft**  
(National Traditional Manufactured Article)  
This is a special technique of craftsmanship with a history of over 1000 years. They hollow a bowl or a tray out of a piece of good-quality wood, such as a horse chestnut or a zelkova tree. Enjoy the warm feeling of the wood.



**Komagatake Shrine Festival**  
(Masterpiece of the Oral and Intangible Heritage / Agematsu Town)  
The festival features a traditional dance in dedication to the god of the shrine, called "Daidai-kagura". Its impressive performing arts have been handed down from father to only one of his sons for over 400 years.



**Hanauma Festival**  
(Masterpiece of the Oral and Intangible Heritage / Nagiso Town)  
Decorated horses with five-color paper flowers parade to the music of flutes and drums to the Itsumiya Shrine. The parade features people scrambling to get the flowers on the back of the horses which are charms against bad luck.



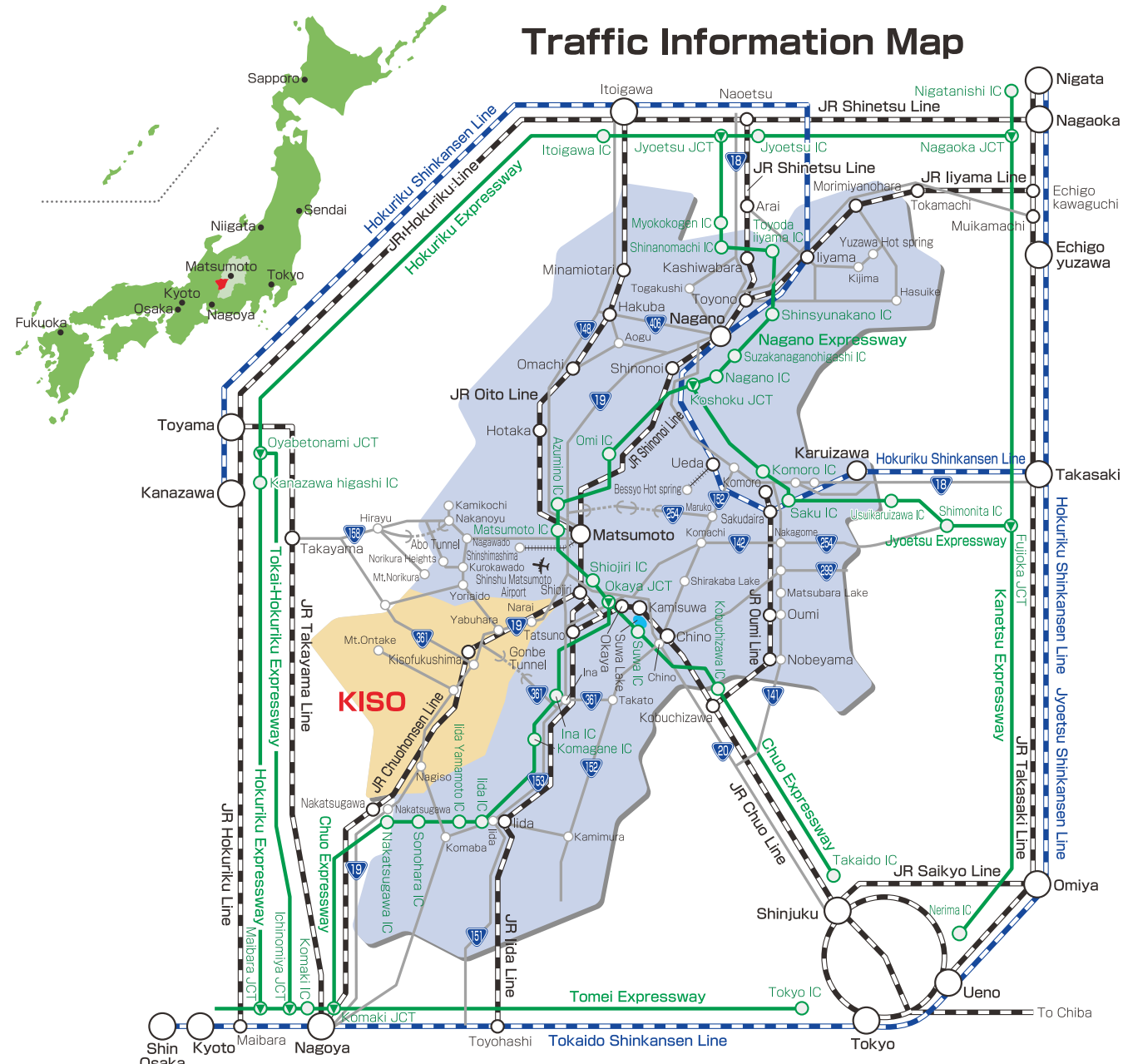
**Kiso Horses**  
(Prefectural Natural Treasure)  
Kiso Horses, also called Kiso-uma, are one of the species of horses indigenous to Japan. They are gentle and friendly, and treated as members of the family. Its long body and short legs are adorable.



**Giant Larch Tree**  
(Prefectural Natural Treasure / Narai, Shiojiri City)  
On a mountain trail from the Gonbei Mountain Pass, you will find a giant larch tree estimated to be 250 years old rising heavenward. This massive tree is said to be one of the oldest and biggest larch trees in Japan.



**Niekawa Horse-chestnut Tree**  
(Prefectural Natural Treasure / Niekawa, Shiojiri City)  
Toward southwest of Niekawajuku, there is an admirable horse-chestnut tree over 1200 years old. Standing quietly, the enormous tree gives off a special mystique as though it has been there throughout the ages as the guardian angel in the region.
